Roberts takes Silver

A young team from Wales travelled to Jersey in early April to compete in the International Primary School Championships.

At the end of the team event, both boys and girls teams found themselves finishing just outside the medals in 4th place after losing to England, Ireland and Scotland.

It was the singles event up next, Wales had four players to qualify through their group and in to the main draw, the young 7 year old Anna Hursey and 10 year old Lauren Stacey made it to the quarter final where they both lost out to strong opponents from Scotland and Ireland.

In the boys singles event it was Joseph Roberts who found himself the only player left in the main draw after fellow Welshman Louie Evans lost out in the last 16 to Thomas Joyce of Ireland. Joseph went on to beat Kai Ghazi-Timms of England in the Quarter Finals and then went onto beat Jamie Liu of England in the Semi Finals 3-0.

Joseph's fine run came to and end in the final of the boys singles where he lost to



Irishman Owen Cathcart who beat Joseph 12-10.11-8,11-6. Joseph Roberts finished the competition with a silver medal and will now look forward to next years primary school champs.

In the consolation Cardiff based Jack ODuffy got to the final of the boys singles and lost out to Irelands David Taylor, whilst Mithun lost out to the same player in the quarters of the consolation.

In the girls it was Lara Whitton of Swansea who went onto win the Gold after beating fellow Welsh team mate Beth Richards in a close semi finals, Lara then went onto beat Guernsey player Marli Barker in the final 3-1.

Coaching qualifications

UKCC (U K Coaching Certificate)

Table Tennis is one of at least 30 sports whose governing body's coaching programme is UKCC endorsed.

The UKCC is a nationally recognised qualification which is managed by Sports Coach UK and is a framework for developing, endorsing and continuously improving sports coach education programmes. The coaching qualifications begin at Level 1 and go up to Level 4.

The Table Tennis programme is managed on behalf of the home countries by English Table Tennis (ETTA).

In Wales, the first UKCC Table Tennis course was tutored by Barry Robertson in March 2008 with 8 candidates ultimately qualifying at Level 1.

Table Tennis Wales then embraced the concept of UKCC and moved to introduce this qualification pathway into their coaching structure. This took some years whilst coaches had the opportunity to "bridge" into UKCC from their TTAW-specific qualification. To the extent that, UKCC qualification is now the only recognised Table Tennis coaching qualification in Wales.

There are currently in excess of 60 Wales based / Welsh table tennis coaches qualified at UKCC Level 1 or above. (This includes one at Level 4 – Ryan Jenkins - and four at Level 3 – Stephen Gertsen, Aled Rhys Howell, Stephen Jenkins and Simon Oyler).

In addition, a total of 20 candidates have just completed the latest round of Level 1 courses. The first in North Wales in Clywedog Sports Centre Wrexham – Eddie Roofe tutored - and the second in South Wales at Cardiff City TTC – Mostyn Lewis as tutor.

Future plans in Wales include :-

• to encourage more ladies to qualify (currently only $\sim 15\%$ of qualified coaches in Wales are female)

- to increase the number of coaches qualified at Level 2 (currently only 12)
- to introduce a Coach Licence scheme which will embrace CPD (continuous professional development).

TTW Leaders Award

This award is aimed at absolute beginners usually volunteers and helpers who want to get more involved and support established coaches.

Considerable recent interest has been shown in this award with a number of initiatives ongoing working with the Urdd and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Wales. To date, a total of 167 have been through this course (87 this season to date).

Tutor Training

A very important part of our future programme to ensure we become self sufficient with regards to course tutors within Wales. One candidate is looking to progress through the Sport Wales programme this year to join the current tutors.

Disability Table Tennis

"insport"

Following an excellent presentation to the panel back in January, TTW has been awarded the Ribbon level of "insport" (the accreditation programme for national governing bodies progressing with plans to broaden opportunities for players with disabilities). Big congratulations to Phil Avery and Julie Furber for the presentation and with Neil Robinson also for the work in meeting the insport standard.

The work uncovered a very strong talent pathway into the Paralympic TT programme in Wales and GB. The sport should be very proud of this work and these results. It was also very honest in highlighting a gap in the player base in recreational club and league levels for disability athletes and has its sights on putting in place programmes to correct this.

There are number of options now being considered for future development. One option is to find a couple of clubs already offering disability TT sessions with another being to work with clubs to create hotspots to promote using the Disability Sport Wales officers and local networks.

We need more coaches and volunteers interested in working with athletes with disabilities and we would encourage as many of them as possible to undertake a Disability Inclusion Training workshop delivered by Disability Sport Wales. Get in touch if you fancy getting onboard.

There is no question that the sport of Table Tennis is an excellent avenue for disabled people to go down and a concerted effort is now to be made to make those opportunities more widely publicised and also to ensure that those delivering disability table tennis are appropriately supported to deliver these sessions.

The Equality Group established by Table Tennis Wales has gone a long way to focus the sport on very important key issues. The secret with all development is to establish a strong plan and then a strong base, to support the volunteers and to keep things simple and move forward at a pace that the sport can deliver. Table Tennis Wales is working towards this.

The success at Ribbon level clearly shows that the will and commitment from the Board is there and that coaches support the development. The website is delivering a good service to members and is also a great asset when promoting good work around Disability

Over the next few months, along with Disability Sport Wales and the insport case officer a review of the Ribbon award and plans for the next stage (Bronze) will be put in place. There is no set timescale and, as already mentioned, developments will move at a pace that the sport can deliver.

Disability players at the Welsh National championships 2014

This year's championships saw the inaugural Disability event.

Under the banner of ITTF Para Table tennis International events are split into the following classifications;

- 5 Wheelchairs classes Class 1-5 (Class 1 being the more severely disabled)
- 5 Standing classes Class 6-10 (Class 6 being the more severely disabled)
- 1 Learning difficulty class Class 11

Because of numbers the Welsh National championships were organised on a round robin basis with two events – Mixed Open wheelchair singles and Mixed open standing singles.

Ashley Davis won the wheelchair event winning all four games and dropping only one set on his way to become Welsh champion.
